WINTER WONDERLAND?

What a winter we are experiencing. By now everyone is frustrated with the back to back snow and ice storms that have affected just about every county in Bucks and beyond. The February 4th storm was classified as the second worst for power outage, behind Hurricane Sandy.

These storms prompt many telephone calls and e-mail communications. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank our Public Works Department. And while they receive a salary, sometimes it's just nice to get a pat on the back for a job well done. The health, safety and welfare of Bensalem residents is my top priority along with Bensalem Township Council, whether it be snow maintenance or grass maintenance.

The timing of this newsletter couldn't be better to provide an explanation of some of the problems our Public Works Department experience that affect our plowing efforts. Our plow drivers work long hours in adverse conditions, and the parked vehicles, fire hydrants, mailboxes, utility poles, etc., make it far more difficult to plow a residential street than a highway or vacant parking lot. Also, the fear of injuring someone or damaging private property adds greatly to the stress of residential snow plowing.

Nonetheless our Public Works Department, sometimes with added Police Officers and Sub-Contractors plow after each and every storm. With the types of snow (snow, snow with freezing rain, etc.) and the frequency of these storms, there have been other issues that have made plowing more challenging. Abandoned vehicles, fallen trees and downed power lines along with bone chilling temperatures. These weather conditions have been unprecedented in recent years.

With that being said, I would like to explain that prior to forecasted winter storms, I enact a Declaration of Disaster Emergency. This ensures that the Bensalem Emergency Management Coordinators who direct the activities of the emergency response, take all appropriate action needed to alleviate the effects of the storms, and to aid in the restoration of essential public services, and to take any other emergency response action deemed necessary to respond.

During a declared disaster emergency, **MOTORISTS ARE ASKED TO REMOVE ALL VEHICLES FROM THE STREETS IMMEDIATELY AND TO REFRAIN FROM STREET PARKING FOR AT LEAST 12 HOURS AFTER THE ROADS HAVE BEEN CLEARED.**

I know it is difficult to be patient while waiting for the plows to come through, or your power supply to be restored. But let's work as a team, neighbors help neighbors, look to assist senior citizens, be a good Samaritan, it's just the right thing to do.

THE BENSLEM TOWNSHIP EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ADVISORY BOARD

The Townships Emergency Management Board is committed to serving the public before, during and after times of emergency. This mission is accomplished by utilizing standards established by the Federal Government as well as the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency. This effort is done in coordination with the Bucks County Emergency Management Agency and the Southeastern Pennsylvania Regional Task Force.

The Township board is established every year by the Mayor. This board was put in place to assist in the planning of activities which should be taken by this municipality during a natural or human caused event in order to protect lives and property of the citizens.

The board is formally made up of several representatives from Police, Fire and EMS as well as citizens with extensive management experience. As a result of lessons learned from previous incidents and the need for an open line of communication between all possible resources, the following departments and agencies are active participants in the advisory board meetings:

Bensalem Township Director of Public Safety, Deputy Director of Public Safety, Director of Finance, Director of Public Works, Director of Building and Planning, Director of Information Technology, Emergency Management Operations Coordinator, Bensalem Fire Rescue Battalion Chief, Bensalem EMS Director, President of the Bensalem Township Fire Chiefs, Bensalem School District representatives, Bucks County Emergency Management Agency as well as numerous members of the Department of Public Safety play a vital role in responding to emergencies on a daily basis.

All persons involved in handling township emergency management activities meet the first Thursday of each month to discuss current issues faced by responders, actual response to events, training for possible events as well as educating members of the special needs community on how to respond to emergencies that they may encounter within their facilities.

Emergency Preparedness Guides are available, in the lobby of the Bensalem Township Municipal Building, to assist you and your family in preparing your own household for potential emergencies that may arise.



BENSALEM WELCOMES NEW K9

Bensalem Police Department welcomes a new K9 to the patrol division. K9 Chief a year and half old German Shepherd will hit the streets next week with his handler Officer Brian Cowden. Chief is Officer Cowden's third K9 partner. Officer Cowden has been a member of the K9 unit since 2004 and has worked both a patrol K9 and narcotics K9 during that time. Officer Cowden and Chief just completed 6 weeks of training in patrol work, consisting of obedience, tracking and apprehension work. Chief is also going to be a narcotics detection dog and he will complete his training this week. Bensalem Police currently have 6 K9s, 4 patrol K9s three of which are cross trained in narcotic detection, 1 single purpose narcotic detection K9 and one single purpose explosive detection K9.



LAW ENFORCEMENT MANAGEMENT TRAINING

On February 7th, Director Fred Harraan, Sergeant Andy Aninsman, Sergeant Dave Richardson, Sergeant Keith Christie and Sergeant Jim Donnelly graduated from Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command.

The School of Police Staff and Command, is a dynamic and intensive 10-week program and is considered one of the premiere law enforcement management training programs in the nation.

"The School of Police Staff and Command prepares progressive law enforcement managers for senior

positions by uniquely combining academic principles with practical applications. The course curriculum includes instruction on various topics related to: management principles; human resource administration; strategic planning and analysis, and law enforcement management and its environment," according to Northwestern University.

Each student is academically challenged through a total of 21 written examinations, projects and quizzes in addition to research papers that are a required part of the curriculum.

According to Sergeant Keith

Christie "at times the 10-week program was challenging, but through hard work and dedication we were able to complete this very prestigious management training program."

During this past graduating class, Sergeant Andy Aninsman was elected class President by his peers and Director Fred Harraan was asked by his classmates to be the keynote speaker at the graduation ceremony.

Bensalem Township Police Department now has a total of fifteen graduates from Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command.

CHILD IDENTIFICATION SAFETY DAY

On April 6, 2014 between the hours of Noon and 3:00 PM, Mayor Joseph DiGirolamo, along with Township Council, will be hosting a Child Identification Safety Day. This Child Identification Safety Day will be unlike any others we have held in the past. Bensalem Township will be partnering with BODE Technology, a forensic DNA laboratory located in Lorton, Virginia, to provide parents with forensic DNA profiles of their children. The child's DNA will be collected in a non-invasive, child friendly manner and sent to BODE Technology for processing. After which, BODE Technology will generate the child's forensic DNA profile and return it directly to the parent. This is for the parents to store safely in the event it is ever needed to help locate a missing child. At no time will BODE Technology or the Bensalem Police retain a copy of the profile.

This event is another Bensalem first and is being funded through the cooperation of BODE Technology along with an additional outside funding source. There will also be other activities for the children at the Police Department including static displays along with Bensalem's finest 4-legged officers. The township is encouraging parents to take advantage of the opportunity to obtain your child's forensic DNA profile in case it is ever needed.



DRUG OVERDOSE ALERT

The Bensalem Township Police Department would like residents of Bensalem Township and the local community to be aware of an increase of prescription drug and heroin related fatal overdoses.

There have been numerous fatal drug related overdoses in the Tri-State area in the past few months. Some of these have been attributed to fentanyl laced heroin seen in the immediate areas of Philadelphia, Bucks and Montgomery Counties and as far away as Pittsburgh, PA.

Prescription drugs such as Oxycodone (Percocet), Hydrocodone (Vicodin), Xanax (Alprazolam), Adderall, Ritalin and Valium (Diazepam) are some of the more commonly abused prescription drugs. Many times these types of drugs are prescribed legally by a physician for a legitimate purpose. These drugs should only be taken when under the direct care of a licensed physician due to the fact that they can be extremely addictive. Often times, the negative side effects of these medications cause the patient to discontinue and store them in a home medicine cabinet. These types of drugs should always be stored in a secure area due to the fact that children and young adults frequently use these drugs recreationally. Many times children and young adults begin their addiction and dependency by abusing these highly addictive substances. In 2009, 16 Million Americans ages 12 and older took a prescription pain reliever, tranquilizer, or sedative for non-medical purposes at least once in the year. The dependency on these prescription pills become so intense it leads the young adults to purchase pills illegally or often times transition to a cheaper alternative such as heroin.

For those who are unfamiliar, Heroin is a highly addictive drug derived from morphine, which is obtained from the opium poppy. It's a "downer" or depressant that affects the brains pleasure system and interferes with the brains ability to perceive pain. Prescription pain killers such as Oxycodone, Hydrocodone, and Morphine have the same effect on the body as heroin. The Drug Enforcement


Administration categorizes heroin as a schedule I narcotic which is considered highly addictive and has no medical purpose. The average heroin user spends approximately \$200.00 a day to support their habit. Each bag of heroin costs the user approximately \$10.00. Many times heroin users must support their addiction by committing crimes of opportunity such as burglaries, robberies, and theft related offenses. In 2013, The Bensalem Township Police

Department saw a dramatic increase in drug related overdoses. This increase is effecting our local community as a direct result of the national drug epidemic sweeping across the country. As a result of the local problem, Director Harran has taken a proactive approach to combat the drug abuse occurring in our community.

"Operation Pain Management" is a new initiative the Police Department created as a direct result of this ongoing problem. The Police Department has increased drug related training for officers, adopted a stricter stance on drug related crimes through enforcement and education, as well as partnering with other local organizations in an effort to reduce drug usage and dependency.

While this operation is in the early stages, the Police Department has currently set up a medicine drop box in the lobby of the Police Department located at 2400 Byberry Road, Bensalem, PA 19020. All members of the community are now encouraged to dispose of their unwanted medications at this location. The Police Department believes this will greatly reduce the chances of medications getting into the hands of the wrong person(s). In addition the Police Department participates in the Drug Enforcement Administration drug take back program twice a year.

The Bensalem Township Police Department has an anonymous tip line (215) 633-3660, as well as other social media contacts such as Twitter and Facebook which can be an extremely valuable tool the community can utilize to provide reports of suspicious activity or suspected drug related crimes in their neighborhood.

"TI SIMULATOR TRAINING"

Two Bensalem Police Officers enter a school zone for the report of "Shots Fired". As they prepare to get additional information from the teacher that approaches them, they're attacked and have to think and act quickly to prevent a disaster from developing. Both officers engage the attackers but are overwhelmed because they did not seek cover. "Stop Scenario" is heard behind them. The officers and the teacher were not harmed during this encounter. A Bensalem Township Use of Force Instructor begins to take the officers through each step of this deadly encounter, clarifying their thoughts and actions and lack of actions. Welcome to the TI Simulator!

Proper preparation is the key to officer and civilian survival. The "TI Training Simulator", is a computer enhanced training device that prepares our officers for moments when their life is on the line and split-second decisions matter. Similar to athletes training for months and years to compete for only a few seconds/moments, practice, repetition and comprehension pay off in the Life-or-Death scenario. Unlike the athlete, Law Enforcement Simulator training prepares our officers for life or death situations, so the reward for winning is safer civilian contact and coming home safe.

The TI Simulator was developed with an eye toward learning "Decision Skills" objectives by using an extremely high degree of realism. They use Departmental input to create highly-effective educational scenarios which challenge the officer's decision making ability and help develop split-second, life-saving skills. When you look at the situation, you will see they incorporate realistic gunfire, explosions and bodily injury. It may seem that this is "over the top" however, all of the extra attention to detail serves one goal - preparing officers to be highly effective in life and death situations. Department Instructors can go over the results with the officers and help them develop better, more practical and appropriate responses.

Due to time constraints and cost, being able to get our officers to the firing range can be difficult on a daily basis, but by using the "virtual marksmanship training" as a supplemental tool, allows more frequent training. With the increasing cost of live ammunition, this option allows the Police Department to fine tune the necessary shooting skills that officers are required to have everyday of their career. The Police Department will specifically see cost savings in ammunition and logistics. Frequent weapon training in the virtual environment allows officers practice with critical decision making skills and weapon handling techniques.

With the TI Simulator, the Police Department is able to run Courses of Fire in realistic environments. The system allows for training officers in "rapid decision making skills" using environmental effects such as wind, rain, snow and light as well as civilian inter-action. You have the option of using pre-loaded, standard Courses of Fire or you can chose to design custom scenarios that are more centered around Bensalem Township.

The Bensalem Township Police Department always strives to better their service to the community they have sworn to Protect and Serve, and the TI Simulator is another giant step towards this goal.

BENSALEM TOWNSHIP OFFERS RESIDENTS FREE ELECTRONIC RECYCLING

Effective, April 1st, Bensalem residents will be able to dispose of unwanted electronics. In cooperation with Reverse Logistics Group Americas, Inc. our Public Works Building will be equipped with the appropriate equipment to implement the program.

"This program meets the needs of our community," states Mayor DiGirolamo. We are following the example of other municipalities and doing what is required by law under the "The Covered Device Recycling Act. We have had one day compliance events for collection of these outdated electronics, however, it is not enough", said the Mayor.

Please clip the following as a guide for what is acceptable and unacceptable at the drop off location, which as stated above is our Public Works Building, located at 3800 Hulmeville Road (near Bensalem Rescue Squad and Imagination Land Playground).

PERMITTING HAS A NEW FACE

RESIDENTIAL SINGLE & TWO FAMILY RESALE OCCUPANCIES

As of November 12, 2013, the Bensalem Building and Planning Department no longer conducts inspections for the resale of single and two family residential units.

However, Bensalem Township Certificates of Occupancy are still required. The Township will issue a certificate upon receipt of the following:

1. Certificate issued by an approved electrical underwriter indicating that the electrical service panel has been inspected and complies with the current National Electrical Code.
2. Maintenance certificate issued by a duly licensed mechanical contractor indicating that the heating system has been inspected and is in good working condition.
3. Certificate issued by a duly licensed chimney sweep indicating that the chimney/flue/vent, has been inspected and is functioning properly.

Applications for Occupancy Permits must still be submitted to the Building and Planning Department with a \$75 application fee and are to be filed (1) one month in advance of the settlement date.



RESIDENTIAL NEW CONSTRUCTION

(includes new home construction, additions & alterations)

Effective November 12, 2013, plan reviews and inspections for all residential construction governed under the International Residential Code will be conducted by Code Inspections Inc.

Applications for Permits must still be submitted to the Bensalem Building and Planning Department with a \$100 application fee *(not required with individual permit applications, e.g. roofing, siding, etc)*.

All applications and plans will be forwarded by the Township to the third party agency for review and inspections. Permits and invoices will be issued by Code Inspections Inc.

New Home construction requires a Bensalem Township Certificate of Occupancy and requires its own application separate from the construction permits. The certificate will be issued once all inspections and approvals have occurred.

For any questions regarding review status or fees on residential projects please contact Code Inspections Inc. at (215) 672-9400.

Stakeout Inspections will still be performed by the township engineer prior to any excavating.

BENSALEM TOWNSHIP SHREDDER EVENT!

NPDES STORMWATER PERMIT

In order to meet the requirements of our NPDES Stormwater permit, the Public Works Department has purchased a Schwarze Vacuum Road sweeper. This sweeper is to be used to keep our 140 miles of roads free of sediment which is harmful to life in our streams, creeks and rivers.
